ALL skiers to be fit and well BEFORE commencement of activities. ALL ski equipment to be suitable and of a mechanical standard for racing. Protective bungs MUST be fitted to tips of ski poles. Matting to be kept in good state of repair by site staff. Crash mats fitted by site staff at finish area of slope and on other potential obstacles. All non-skiers on slope MUST wear high-viz jackets and remain vigilant at all times. Course set by the organisers will be appropriate for a wide range of skiing ability including beginners. General points:-

All stall organisers or vendors will be made aware of this RA and asked to comply. All stalls and vendors will be responsible for their own safety on site and the management of their own health and safety.

Any electrical or other power sources MAY be inspected prior to use on the day and will be expected to conform with all current safety regulations relating to electrical or other power supplies. NO ELECTRICAL GENERATORS WILL BE PERMITTED ON SITE other than that used by the race organisers. A minimum requirement will be current PAT marking on all electrical items in use.

Vendors will make available if requested a Health and Safety policy document for inspection by organisers which will be kept on file by SASA.
